ENTRY CONDITION - PREREQUISITES

- > Successful completion of selection process
- > Private Pilot Certificate, Instrument Rating, Commercial Pilot Certificate Multi-Engine, Certified Flight Instructor Certificate
- > Payment of training fees
- > Proof of citizenship*
- > FAA medical certificate
- > *For those students who are not U.S. Citizens, the following items are also required: proof of funding for all educational expenses, demonstration of English language proficiency, Insurance Policy, and other international student enrollment documents

Note: You will not be registered for the program until you have provided evidence of compliance with all of the above prerequisite requirements. Failure to provide such evidence within three (3) months of signature of this agreement may result in your Training Agreement being cancelled.
